- 1. Where do you currently share life with others? Think of places both inside and outside the church.
- 2. Think about the church experiences or communities you've been a part of.
 - a. Have they been primarily life-giving for you?
 - b. Why or why not?
- 3. Read Ephesians 4:1-6 and Galatians 3:26-28.
 - a. What do these passages emphasize about God's people and their life together?
 - b. What would happen to Central Heights (or the churches of Abbotsford) if we understood that those who have a genuine faith in Jesus have more alike than different?
- 4. Discuss why isolation for a follower of Jesus can be a dangerous thing, Use Hebrews 10:23-25 to guide your discussion.
- 5. Of the three categories of application below, which one stands out to you as the place God may be nudging you to go 'ALL IN'? Share why.
 - a. Meet together
 - b. Give together
 - c. Thank God together
- 6. We all have people in our life who are disconnected from the community life of Christianity.
 - a. Who in your life would you like to see step into fellowship?
 - b. Take time to pray for them by name.

b. FELLLOWSHIP [KOINONIA]

- a. To share with someone in something
- b. Contributions, table fellowship
- c. General friendship and unity which characterizes the community

c. 3 REASONS TO COMMIT TO COMMUNITY

a. Committing fellowship is the right thing to do

- **a.** The community is centered around Jesus [who He is and what He's done]
- **b.** Saying 'yes' to Jesus means we become a part of a community
- **c.** Our shared desperation leads to a shared transformation
- **d.** Jesus is the great unifier, He links us together
- e. Jesus' work is the foundation that brings us together and equalizes all things
- f. Faith is not a private thing but a community thing

b. Committing to fellowship is a smart thing to do

- **a.** Together we are stronger [there's a greater strength in community]
- **b.** Isolation creates vulnerability, fellowship creates durability
- c. Fellowship amplifies what God says and builds our faith

c. Committing to fellowship is a compelling thing to do

- a. What we have in common changes how we live together
- **b.** As God works in community it is compelling to those outside the community
- c. God is creating a people to show and offer the world something different
