

ALL IN: Inevitable

Acts 2:42-27

1. This series “All In” notes that the church in Acts became a powerful movement. Why do you think we sometimes don’t think of that possibility for ourselves?
2. We sometimes unwittingly diminish God’s power in our requests of him.
 - a. Have you doubted God’s ability to deliver, save, heal, or restore you from a particular circumstance? Share why that might be the case.
3. Read Ephesians 3:20-21. In light of what Paul says about God and God’s ability, how should we be praying? Do our prayers reflect the reality of who God is?
4. Jesse noted several ways that we can individually step into a position to experience new activity from God: being in the Word, committing to community, praying consistently, giving financially, serving with our resources, and praising more.
 - a. What could you individually decide to do to put yourself in a position for seeing new activity from him?
 - b. How will you apply/practice this decision?
5. People still need Jesus; he wants to transform our lives more than he wants to improve the way we experience life.
 - a. Who do you know that needs to experience Jesus’ transformation?
 - b. How could you partner with the Holy Spirit and reach them?

[Additional notes on the message]

1. 3 REMINDERS

a. God's power has not diminished

- i. God's power has not changed or diminished since He was active in the early church
- ii. We already trust God for the greatest possible miracle [the resurrection], so why don't we trust Him for the things in our lives?

b. Christianity is bigger than me

- i. Everything revolves around the person and work of Jesus
- ii. We limit the space God has to work when we make it about ourselves and our preferences, rather than God's purposes

c. People still need Jesus

- i. Jesus is life and He is the way to life, freedom, and hope
- ii. People still need what Jesus offers
