## **READY**

- **1.** As you go through life, how often do you think about the return of Jesus and what will happen when He comes back?
- **2.** Read 1 Peter 4:7-11.
  - a. What does Peter mean by the 'end of all things is at hand'?
  - b. How is this reality meant to affect your perspective about today?
- **3.** As we think about the end of all things:
  - a. What is Peter encouraging followers of Jesus to do?
  - b. Why do you think Peter highlights these specific activities?
- **4.** In verse 9 Peter tells us to 'Show hospitality to one another without grumbling.'
  - a. What is Peter talking about when he talks about hospitality?
  - b. How might practicing hospitality play a part in addressing the sin of racism?
- **5.** How do the spiritual gifts we receive from God play a part in the life of faith and in being the church?
- **6.** What are some ways you could use the gifts you have in this season to make a difference in someone else's life?
