 - b. Why do you think Peter highlights these specific activities?

 - a. What is Peter talking about when he talks about hospitality?
 - b. How might practicing hospitality play a part in addressing the sin of racism?
5. How do the spiritual gifts we receive from God play a part in the life of faith and in being the church?
6. What are some ways you could use the gifts you have in this season to make a difference in someone else's life?
